

INVADING FLORA OF THE FIELDS OF FLAX IN CASTILLA AND LEÓN (SPAIN)

The study realized on the invading flora of the fields of linen of Castilla and León ,puts of manifest that the weeds that there develop are typically of drylands, very rich, so much in species, as in populations, for what his control in some occasions is difficult. The botanical families to which they concern are very numerous, having been 29 very frequent families and pollutants, between that they stand out: amaranthaceae, chenopodiaceae, convolvulaceae, cruciferae, compositae, gramineae, labiatae, polygonaceae, rubiaceae, zyfophyllaceae, etc..
